## Job Purpose

To contribute to the development and delivery of Cinematic Arts and associated programmes at undergraduate and postgraduate levels and to contribute to an outstanding student experience in preparation for progression into professional life. To conduct high quality research activities aligned with the strategic research priorities of the subject area. To undertake administrative duties in line with the effective delivery of taught programmes, high quality research activity and the operational requirements of the School.

## **Main Duties**

- 1. To engage in the design, development and delivery of provision in Cinematic Arts and related areas in the School of Arts and Humanities.
- 2. To contribute to the work of the Ulster Screen Academy and related strategic initiatives
- 3. To develop industry links and networks that relate to teaching and research in Cinematic Arts.
- 4. To undertake administrative duties, such as module coordinator, year tutor or work placement coordinator, in support of the academic programme and the operational effectiveness of the School.
- 5. To engage with the research activities in the school and in the wider aligned disciplinary community in the university and develop/contribute to work leading to high quality research outputs and research impact, particularly through practice-as-research.
- 6. To deliver high quality learning and teaching to students including in face-to-face and online environments, ensuring industry and professional relevance and standards where appropriate.
- 7. To supervise and support students in studios, workshops and other locations, as required.
- 8. To contribute to a high quality student experience through induction, teaching, field work, placements, graduate employability initiatives, creative, cultural and enterprise activities as well as further enhancing the international outlook
- 9. To deliver mentoring, studies advice and pastoral care.

- 10. To play a significant part in the total quality management of the subject area and participate in the evaluation of curriculum design and of the quality of learning and teaching provided by subject staff
- 11. To contribute to recruitment, publicity and promotional activities in the interests of the subject provision, the School, Faculty and University.

- 13. To undertake other duties not specifically stated above, which from time to time are necessary for the effective performance of the University's business appropriate to the grade and nature of the post
